The pastfew weeks' incidents triggered by entities sitting outside India, have brought to the fore the limitations that the country's security agen-cies are facing when it comes to countering the "anti-India" psychological warfare or psy-war being fought on social media platforms, especially Twitter. Last year, faceless assess ments and appeals were in-troduced, this year's Budget introduces provisions for a faceless Income Tax Appellate Tribunal to simplify the appellate procedure. All hearings (if granted) before the ITAT are now proposed to take place over video conferencing. The ITAT, being the final fact-finding authority and entrusted with a quasi-judicial function cannot work faceless. The principal of natural justice also requires a proper hear-ing to be given to the parties. By making the ITAT faceless the importance of this great institution is being undermined. Budget 2021 has proposed various clarifications to clear the ambiguity such as excluding the income that is already taxed as royalty or fees from tech-nical services from the purview of the EL. Australia, India, Japan, and the US have been develop-ing the Quad security dialogue to advance the FOIP strategy, Meanwhile, Beijing expresses their opposition to both the FOIP and the Quad. Q: What are the prospects of US-Japan security ties under President Foe Biden and Prime Minister Suga? Do you see the relationship between the US and Japan will strengthen further 4: The Biden administration aims to put emphasis on international coopera-tion and America's alliance partnership to recover US credibility and reliability in the world. I agree with this policy direction. On the other hand, American soci-

top priority to repair and rebuild the social cohesion of the United States. So far it is not so certain to which direction the Biden administration's Indo-Pacific Strategy will actually move forward. There are two fun-damental questions. First, if Biden's China policy would seek for the cooperation and compromise with Chi-na through their strategic dialogue as the Obama administration did, then Biden might repeat Obama's mistakes again. The US engage-ment policy with China as a "responsible stakeholder" failed to stop China's as sertive expansion after all. Second, Biden's new Indo-Pacific strategy might take a new approach, based on more inclusive allies and partners, which are differ-ent from the FOIP, Noneseriously. It would be the best outcome if this kind of Biden's new inclusive part-nership approach could discourage the hegemonic expansion of China and Russia, Otherwise, if Biden's new approach seeks for the coexistence and coprosper-ity with China and Russia by further compromise and

A: The Quad concept is a key strategy for realising peace and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific region. In re-cent years, the Quad security framework has been rapidly making progress for two reasons. First, China's pro-vocative attempts led to the China-India border conflict last year. It is appreciated that Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership deals with China's provide deals with China's provo-cations by self-restrained response and deterrence Second, China's bullying pressures on Australia leads o the deterioration of Aus-ralian public perceptions of China. It is apparently against international trade rules that Beijing put high trade pressures on Austral-ian export markets such as barley, beef, wine, and iron ore by introducing mas-sive tariff, strict control or sanctions. Beijing's coercive approaches to New Delhi and Canberra are due to the strategic mismanagement

these Chinese behaviours push the Quad security co-operation much closer: The Quad framework is a

Foreign Minister-level security dialogue at this time. This Quad framework is ex-pected to step up to a summit-level security dialogue framework, Furthermore, the Ouad should build a Quad-based security frame-work to support countries of Southeast and Southwest Asia by promoting various security cooperations: defence equipment coop-eration, capacity-building measures, joint training, and joint exercise. If these joint security cooperation measures are properly im-plemented, then the Quad framework will become the key pillars of regional peace and security in the Indo-

Q: What is the prospect of Quae gradually turning into Quad Plus? What specific interest 4a pan bolds with regar to the Quad Plus narrative? How do you see China's offensiese expansion un-Centra's offensive expansion un-der President Xi Jinping? How should Tokyo cope with it in co-operation with the US and other Quad partners? A: In recent years, major Eu-

ropean countries keep much interest in the Indo-Pacific region and send their naval tralia and New Zealand join together to ensure the im entation of the relevant UN Security Council resolutions on North Korea in addressing illicit maritime activities and ship-to-ship transfers. Meanwhile, Canberra and Tokyo are also talking about Japan's escort of Australian force and the conclusion of the Japan-Australia Reciprocal Access Agreement (Japan-Australia RAA similar to Status of Forces Agreement). Major Euro-pean countries also join the Indo-Pacific regional security. In this year, 2021, UK will deploy its aircraft career "Queen Elizabeth" to Asia. Germany also sends its frigate warship to Asia, France, Germany, Italy, and the UK have already published their Indo-Pacific strategy. The Quad members should consider inviting these West European countries to join the Quad security framework with an affiliate member-

Q: What role do you expect In-dia to play? How do you assess the future of India Japan ties in a rapidly changing geo-politica

A: In this strategic context, if any serious situation happens in the foreseeable future, it would probably occur in the maritime/air spheres of the South China Sea and the East China Sea (including Taiwan and the Senkaku Islands of Japan). It should be noted that India's role is critical to main tain peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region. No other country but India can ensure the freedom and security of navigation in the Indian Ocean, Japan and India should work together to overcome this current Covid-19 crisis, and then redouble our efforts to ensure the peace and stability of the Indo-Pacific in closer coop-eration, and to maintain our shared universal values of

Psychological warfare, as per experts, is a planned use of propaganda and other of propaganda and other psychological operations to influence the opinions, emo-tions, attitudes, and behavjour of people.

It is pertinent to mention here that the relevant intelligence agencies have a cyber-desk to counter such psy-war operations, but as recent incidents have shown, have been found to be incapable of handling the challenge. According to the official quoted, rather than getting "obsessed" about Pa-kistan's capabilities, Indian policymakers need to focus on how to reach a stage where India can carry out an attack without using physical force and chanage the enemy by us ing social media to conduct a

"A lot of churning is needed as new people, who are aware of what and how to do, need to be brought in. Our policy-makers are still to wake up to the damage that psy-war can cause. Perhaps the recent incidents will wake them up." the official said.
