Armenia develops 5G broadband network

The Ministry of High-Tech Industry has liberalized the 3600-3800 MHz frequency band for the introduction of a 5G broadband network in order to provide it to a mobile communication operator through a tender procedure. The ministry said that it is now developing the quality standards and the terms of the tender package for the public mobile 5G broadband connection. The ministry told Armenpress that it organized meetings with mobile communication operators in Armenia to discuss issues related to the introduction of 5G networks and their readiness and interest to participate in the tender and implement the work.

US confirms nuclear pact with Armenia 'under consideration'

The United States has confirmed it is studying a request by Armenia to ink a deal that would allow Washington to transfer civil nuclear technology to Yerevan. That could pave the way for the United States to design and build a new nuclear power plant in Armenia to replace the country's aging, Soviet-era facility in the town of Metsamor. "The U.S. Government does not share details of the negotiation process, but we can share that the State Department is giving Armenia's request for a 123 Agreement the proper attention and due consideration," a State Department spokesperson said in written comments to CivilNet on August 22. The spokesperson gave no other details on what they called "the internal process for U.S. government negotiations with other countries," including a timeline for a final decision.

Armenia seeks advanced drones, missiles from India to boost its defence against Azerbaijan

Armenia is actively expanding its defence procurement strategy by seeking advanced drones and medium-range surface-to-air missiles from India. This move is part of Armenia's broader efforts to enhance its military capabilities secure and its airspace. Armenia has already acquired the Akash-1S Air Defence system and is considering additional acquisitions. The potential purchases include the Indo-Israeli MR medium-range air defence systems and the Akash-NG air defence systems. Armenia's procurement of the Akash-1S system marks a significant step in its defence strategy. The Akash-1S is a sophisticated air defence system capable of shooting down aircraft at distances of up to 30 kilometers. This system provides reliable protection against air threats, enhancing Armenia's air defence capabilities. However, media reports indicate that India has not yet started delivering the Akash-1S system to

Armenia, with deliveries expected to begin next year. In addition to the Akash-1S, Armenia is showing interest in two other advanced systems: the MR-SAM and the Akash-NG.

Armenia and Azerbaijan sign regulation on joint activity of delimitation commissions

"In accordance with the Protocol of the 8th meeting of the Commission on Delimitation and Border Security of the State Border between the Republic of Armenia and the Republic of Azerbaijan and the State Commission on the Delimitation of the State Border between the Republic of Azerbaijan and the Republic of Armenia signed on April 19, 2024, the Commissions completed the alignment of the Regulation on joint activity. On August 30, 2024, the Regulation on joint activity of the Commissions was signed accordingly. Currently, the Republic of Armenia and the Republic of Azerbaijan have begun the implementation of internal procedures," the Armenian Foreign Ministry said in a statement.

Azerbaijan conducts air-defence drills near neighbor Iran

Azerbaijan's military conducted airdefence drills this week, just days after carried neighboring Iran out naval exercises near their shared border. The drills, part of Azerbaijan's 2024 training plan, involved the country's Air Defence Units in tactical-special exercises. According to the Azerbaijani Defence Ministry, "combat crews of the S-300 Favorit anti-aircraft missile complexes the equipment to combat brought readiness, moved to designated positions, and successfully completed tasks related to area preparation and camouflage." The ministry's statement also noted that the exercises focused on protecting critical infrastructure from air attacks and repelling simulated enemy rocket strikes. "The aim of these exercises is to enhance the theoretical knowledge and practical skills of military personnel, and to maintain a high level of combat readiness within the air defence units," the statement said.

American think tank highlights role of Iran-made drones worldwide

Foundation for Defence of Democracies (FDD), an American think tank, has acknowledged that various countries worldwide welcome Iranian-made drones. As the Biden administration desperately tries to prevent or limit a missile and drone attack by Iran and its proxies against the Israeli regime, it would be wise to remember that West Asia is already awash in Iranian projectiles, the FDD said in an article. The initial strike followed a historic first long-range Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) strike by Yemen's Ansarullah against Tel Aviv, killing one person. The FDD claimed that the UAV was made in Iran and completed a 2,600 km flight path. One way Iran can elicit state interest is by highlighting the role its low-cost systems, like drones; have played

on the battlefield, the American think tank noted. The Shahed-136 UAV—also called the Geran-2—has been instrumental in Russia's ongoing war against Ukraine, with Moscow firing a reported 4,600 drones in the first two years of the conflict. The same drone was also featured in Iran's April 13 attack against Israel, the FDD said.

Iran army radar systems monitor US Army F-35 flights

A senior Iranian army commander has said that the army radars in the south of the country detected and monitored the flight of several American F-35 fighters over the Persian Gulf recently. Brigadier General Reza Khajeh, the deputy commander of operations of the Iranian Army Air Defence Force pointed to the presence of American F-35 stealth fighter jets in the Persian Gulf region and said that "Over the past days, several of these planes were flying over the Persian Gulf and were fully monitored by our radars from the moment they took off." General Khajeh added, "All radars located in the south of the country were monitoring these planes momentarily." Khajeh also stressed that, "All flights by the powers beyond the region in the Persian Gulf, the Strait of Hormuz and the Sea of Oman are definitely monitored and checked by our radars, especially the radars located in the southern edge of the country, and they are warned if necessary." "There has been no flight that reported was by our

eavesdropping systems but not detected by our radars," the deputy commander of operations of the Iranian Army Air Defence Force further noted.

Iran Army stages large-scale electronic warfare drills

Army has Iran's staged large-scale electronic warfare drills codenamed "the Shield of the Guardians of Jurisprudence" in central areas of the country. Various divisions of the Iranian Army launched a large-scale and joint military exercise involving electronic warfare units and the country's domestically featuring designed and manufactured radars, drones, micro aerial vehicles (MAVs), and other military equipment on August 23. Units from the Army's Ground Force, Air Force, Navy, and Air Defence participated in the joint aerial maneuver, codenamed Separ-e Hafezan-e Velayat 1402 (The Shield of the Guardians of Jurisprudence 1402), whose headquarters were located in the central areas of the country. According to Deputy Chief of Iran's Army for Coordination Rear Admiral Habibollah Sayyari, the drill features different types of homegrown electronic warfare systems, radars, drones, cyber and aerospace systems, manned and unmanned fighter jets, micro aerial vehicles as well as fixed, mobile, groundand air-based systems related to electronic warfare.

Iraqi FM highlights Baghdad's efforts to prevent regional war

Iraqi Foreign Minister Fuad Hussein reiterated Iraq's efforts to avoid slipping into a Middle Eastern war, emphasizing that Baghdad is actively working both internally and externally to prevent the conflict in the region from escalating. In an interview with Al Arabiya/Al Hadath, Hussein stated, "The entire region is at risk, but the intense international efforts to secure a ceasefire in Gaza may help impose a relative calm across the region." He noted that Iraq "is part of the efforts aimed at de-escalation, though these efforts have yet to yield concrete results." The Iraqi Foreign Minister warned that "the tension will persist if a truce is not reached in Gaza," emphasizing that "dragging Iraq into a state of war is dangerous, and both the government and political parties understand this issue." Hussein also revealed that "Iraqi diplomatic efforts successfully prevented Washington from retaliating against the attack on Ain Al-Asad airbase."

Iraqi airstrike targets ISIS logistical hideout in Diyala, killing cell members

On August 22, the General Military Intelligence Directorate announced that Iraqi warplanes conducted an airstrike targeting an ISIS cell in Diyala governorate, in northeastern Iraq. The Directorate "F-16 stated. aircraft successfully carried out the strike at 7:00 AM, targeting a hideout in the Hamrin Mountains within the Divala operations area." "The operation resulted in the death of the terrorist cell members and the destruction of the hideout, including a fuel tank, munitions, and logistical supplies," it added. "The hideout was used to provide logistical support to ISIS operatives." Despite losing much of its territorial control, ISIS remains a significant threat in Syria and Iraq, with an estimated 5,000 to 7,000 members and supporters, half of whom are fighters, according to a UN report. The group continues to pose a severe risk due to its history of brutal attacks and ongoing recruitment efforts.

Iraqi Air Defence shoots down Turkish Drone in Kirkuk

Iraqi air defences shot down a Turkish drone over Kirkuk on August 29, causing material damage to a residential area but no casualties, according to military and security sources. The incident unfolded at approximately 10:00 AM when the Iraqi Air Defence system detected the drone near Kiwan Camp, northwest of Kirkuk city. A security source in Kirkuk said that after the drone entered the northern and eastern airspace of the city, a warning was issued, following standard air defence protocol. "At 10:25 AM, the French-made Pantsir air defence system shot down the drone." The security source said, "It crashed into a residential house in Kirkuk's

Tese'in neighborhood, causing material damage but no injuries." An examination of the debris identified the downed aircraft as a Turkish-made TAI Anka drone, the source said, adding that the parts have been transferred to a military site for further investigation.

Iraqi group claims drone attack on US base in Syria

The US Department of Defence has issued a statement warning that it reserves the right to respond to any attacks on its forces in both Iraq and Syria. Pentagon officials have not yet provided further details about the incident or confirmed the attack.

Israeli startups provide IDF with tech advantage

Since October 7, the Ministry of Defence Directorate of Defence, Research and Development (DDR&D) (MAFAT) has procured an array of products from more than 100 startups operating in both the defence and commercial markets. People familiar with the subject have told "Globes" that some of them have signed contracts with the Ministry of Defense worth more than NIS 20 million each, and the overall amount of deals amounts to about NIS 1 billion. A Demo Day was recently held for startups that graduated from the DDR&D accelerator, in the presence of Defence Ministry director general Major General (res.) Eyal Zamir and the head of DDR&D Brigadier General (res.) Dr. Danny Gold.

Ireland said open to buying Israeli drones despite being fierce critic over Gaza war

Amid the war in Gaza, Ireland has emerged as one of the European nations most critical of Israel, with Dublin officially recognizing a Palestinian state, joining allegations of genocide against Israel in the World Court, and maintaining a steady stream of criticism against Israel in various EU forums. Nonetheless, the Irish military is open to considering bids from Israeli firms for an upcoming tender for a fleet of drones, and over the last decade has purchased millions of euros' worth of military equipment from Israeli defense firms, according to a August 21, report in the Irish Times. Ireland's Defence Forces Corps of Engineers has opened a tender to purchase 14 unarmed used military drones to be for "surveillance, survey, inspection and search and rescue," in addition to classified missions, the report said, a package with an estimated total price tag of €600,000 (\$667,000). Israeli defense firms are "well-positioned to secure the contract" as a "world leader in drone technology," the report said, citing unnamed sources in the Irish military.

Jordan condemns Israeli settler attacks in Qalqilya

Kingdom on August 16 condemned the ongoing "terrorist" attacks by Israeli settlers against Palestinians, including the recent attack on the village of Jit, east of Oalgilya, which resulted in the death of a young man, the injury of dozens and damage to Palestinian property, according to a Foreign Ministry statement. Sufyan Qudah, the ministry's spokesperson, held Israel responsible for the attack on Jit and condemned the continued tolerance of such terrorist acts by settlers. Israel, as an occupying force, bears full responsibility for these violations and the escalating violence caused by its aggressive unilateral actions targeting Palestinians, their land, and their homes through settlement expansion and forced displacement of Palestinians, he said. Qudah reiterated Jordan's rejection of these attacks and the increase in settler terrorism against the Palestinians, noting that this escalation by extremist settlers has continued since the beginning of the Israeli aggression on Gaza. He called on the international

community to impose effective sanctions to stop settler terrorism and urged the global community to shoulder its responsibilities.

Kuwait signs 15-year Qatar gas deal

In a significant move that underscores the strength of the energy sector in the region, Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) and Oatar Energy announced their second long-term sales and purchase agreement for the supply of up to 3 million tons per year of liquefied natural gas (LNG) to Kuwait, which was signed on August 26. Building on the foundation laid by their initial agreement signed in 2020, this new contract solidifies the ongoing strategic cooperation between the two companies and further strengthens the future of energy cooperation between the two nations. The agreement aims to leverage the strengths and expertise of both companies and addresses the growing global demand for cleaner energy solutions. Through this deal, KPC seeks to transition towards cleaner energy sources through LNG use, which will help reduce emissions and improve domestic air quality. In addition, it will secure a stable supply of energy resources while meeting Kuwait's growing energy demand in the power sector. KPC CEO Sheikh Nawaf Saud Al-Sabah stated: "This second longterm agreement with QatarEnergy within a

short period of time confirms our longstanding collaboration with our Qatari brethren to provide a cleaner source of energy plays in line with our Energy Transition 2050 strategy."

Arabs discuss ways to tackle IT crimes

The first conference officials of responsible for combating information technology crimes in Arab interior ministries kicked off Wednesday in the Tunisian capital with the participation of Kuwait. Secretary-General of the Council of Arab Interior Ministers, Dr Mohammad Koman, called in his opening speech for enhancing cooperation among Arab countries in combating cybercrimes by exchanging information immediately. Koman said that the interest of the Council of Arab Interior Ministers in cybersecurity and combating information system crimes began in the early nineties of the last century; "therefore, the General Secretariat is keen to work on developing practical frameworks to confront this type of crime." He added that a set of measures were taken, including the approval of the Arab Guiding Strategy for Combating Information Technology Crimes in 2014 and the establishment of a unit specialized in electronic security. The Kuwaiti Interior Ministry delegation is represented by Colonel Ahmed Al-Hamoud and Major Thanyan Ruh Al-Din. The conference, which aims to develop an Arab plan to confront crimes committed using artificial intelligence, is attended by representatives of the interior ministries in Arab countries, the Arab League, the United Nations Regional Center for Combating Cybercrime, in addition to the Naif Arab University for Security Sciences and the General Secretariat of the Council of Arab Interior Ministers.

Missile barrage from Lebanon escalates tensions in northern Israel

A fresh wave of missile attacks was launched from Lebanon towards Upper Galilee, with direct hits reported in the Israeli settlement of Shomera. Israeli media outlets have confirmed injuries in Shomera following the impact. As the situation escalated, sirens blared across several northern Israeli communities. including Netu'a, Shtula, Kedmit Tzafi, Kelaa, Katzrin, Sha'al, Dafne, Hagoshrim, Ghajar, Kibbutz Dan, Shenir, She'ar Yeshuv, Beit Hillel, Kfar Gilad, Metula, Maayan Baruch, Maskaf Am, Kiryat Shmona, Margaliot, Manara, and Marom Golan. Despite the launch of four drones, the Israeli military failed to intercept them. In retaliation, Israeli artillery shelled the outskirts of Kfar Shouba, while drone strikes targeted areas near Nagoura and a motorcycle on the road between Al-Shahabiyeh and Bafleh. Additionally, an Israeli air raid struck the town of Al-Dhahirah in southern Lebanon. The Lebanese Ministry of Health reported that

two citizens were killed in Israeli airstrikes on the town of Dahira in southern Lebanon. Israeli Defence Minister has recently threatened to escalate attacks on Lebanon, with many Israeli forces being relocated from Gaza to the northern border to counter the increasing Hezbollah assaults.

Israeli strikes in Lebanon spark warnings of all-out war

Tensions between Israel and Lebanon have sharply escalated, raising fears of a fullscale conflict. Israeli artillery targeted multiple sites in southern Lebanon, including the town of Beit Lif, while warplanes shattered the sound barrier over Beirut and the southern regions. This intensification follows the assassination of Khalil al-Maqdah, brother of Fatah leader Munir al-Maqdah, in an Israeli drone strike on Sidon. The Israeli army confirmed the strike, stating that they targeted al-Maqdah in a raid on southern Sidon. The escalation is further fueled by calls from Israeli National Security Minister Itamar Ben Gvir, who, during a visit to the Northern settlements affected by rocket attacks, urged for an all-out war against Hezbollah. Ben Gvir's statements were echoed by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who warned, "We are prepared for any scenario, whether in defence or attack," emphasizing the strength of Israel's Air Force.

In response, Hezbollah claimed responsibility for multiple attacks on

Israeli targets, including the bombing of espionage equipment at the Birkat al-Risha site and the shelling of the Al-Malikiyah site.

'You are Complicit' – journalists call on US to impose arms embargo on Israel

"By providing the weapons being used to deliberately kill journalists, you are complicit in one of the gravest affronts to press freedom today." A group of more than 100 journalists, news outlets and press freedom organizations have urged the US government to "immediately cease" the transfer of all weapons to Israel. "More than 160 journalists" have been killed by Israel since it launched its war on Gaza last October, they said in a letter addressed to US Secretary of State, Antony Blinken, on August 15, noting that this "is the largest recorded number of journalists killed in any war." "Israel's military actions are not possible without U.S. weapons, U.S. military aid, and U.S. diplomatic support. By providing the weapons being used to deliberately kill journalists, you are complicit in one of the gravest affronts to press freedom today," the letter stated. It comes just over a week after Palestinian journalist Ismail al-Ghoul and his cameraman Rami al-Rifi were killed in an Israeli bombing that targeted their vehicle.

'Profiting from war crimes' – lawyers seek arms export ban to UK court

"The UK is profiting from war crimes. This can and must be stopped." Lawyers have submitted graphic testimonies of torture and denial of medical treatment of Palestinians in Gaza to London's High Court in a bid to stop the UK government from issuing arms export licenses to British companies supplying weapons to Israel, the Guardian has reported. The submission of more than 100 pages includes statements from 14 witnesses including Palestinian and Western medical doctors working in Gaza's hospitals, as well as ambulance drivers, civil defense department workers and aid workers, the report said. The evidence, the report said, was" designed to support a request for a court order that the UK government has acted irrationally in refusing to ban the sale of arms" to Israel. The government had argued that there was "not a clear risk the weapons would be used to commit breaches of international humanitarian law," the report added.

US return of offensive weapons sales to top customer Saudi Arabia set to boost revenue

The US decision to lift its ban on selling offensive weapons to Saudi Arabia not only brings a key security partner in the Middle East back to the fold, but also Washington's biggest customer. The Biden administration reversed the three-year-old policy this month, which was originally meant to pressure the kingdom over its involvement in the Yemen war – a move that the US may now be regretting given its own need to curb the Houthis now. Saudi Arabia – the main recipient of US arms exports from 2019-2023, according to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (Sipri), could boost revenue that made up 15 per cent of total US global arms exports at the time."[There is] quite a large amount of arms going to Saudi [Arabia]," Mathew George, director of the arms transfers programme at Sipri, who anticipates that will increase with the lifting of the restrictions. It is not clear how many offensive weapons, described in part as air-to-ground munitions by the State Department on August 9, would contribute to total US weapons exports to the kingdom. The US is expected to send shipments of thousands of bombs to Saudi Arabia worth more than \$750 million in the coming months after lifting the embargo, The Wall Street Journal previously reported.

Turkey inaugurates naval shipyard, submarine floating dock to service newly built subs

Highlighting a focus on expanding its naval capabilities, Turkey has inaugurated Aksaz Shipyard command, put into service the first floating dock and announced a number of other maritime milestones. "We are cognizant of the fact that in order to live in peace on our lands, we must have a strong and effective navy in both our blue homeland and distant geographies," Turkish president Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said at a ceremony at the yard on August 25. Located in Marmaris district, Aksaz Shipyard Command is run by ministry of defence along with primary contractor ASFAT, a government-affiliated firm. According to an ASFAT statement, as of this weekend the shipyard officially hosts the world's largest submarine floating dock with 3,000-ton lifting capacity, after the dock successfully completed tests and operational trials. Submarines themselves also took part in the large ceremony, as the Turkish Navy formally commissioned TCG Piri Reis (S-330), the first submarine of the "New Type Submarine Project," while a second submarine TCG Hizir Reis (S-331) started its sea trials and a third submarine, TCG Murat Reis (S-332) was docked for fitting.
